About Enko Botho Campus:

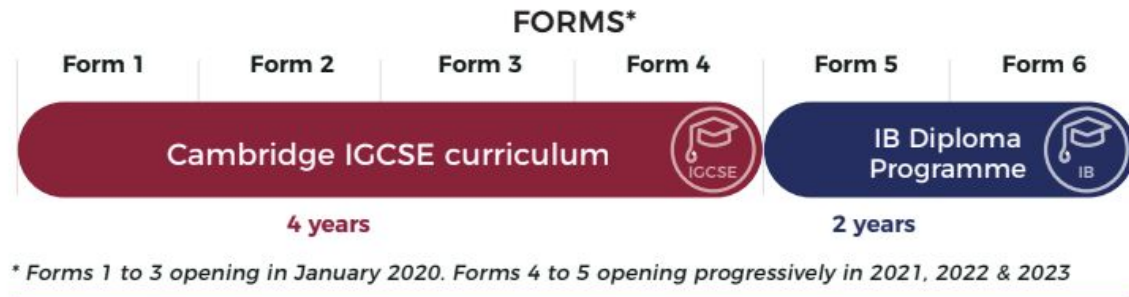

Curriculum:

In just 4 years students obtain their IGCSEs and are then encouraged to pursue their studies with the IBDP.

The Cambridge IGCSE is the world's most popular international qualification for 14-16 year olds. It is recognised by leading universities and employers worldwide and is an international passport to progression and success. The curriculum offers a variety of routes for learners with a wide range of abilities, including those whose first language is not English. Throughout the IGCSE programme the learner will be evaluated through written, oral, coursework and practical assessment, and they are tested at the end of the course.

The International Baccalaureate (IB) is for 16-19-year-olds; there are over 5,000 IB schools in 150 countries. The IB is recognised by universities for the holistic and rigorous education it provides.

Combined, these programmes prepare students to excel in over 10,000 universities worldwide.
