Text Books & Reading Options

No child should be without books. No learner should be without a textbook.

Following the parent meeting and subsequent discussions with teachers, the new textbook policy at Amazing Grace is as follows:

For Secondary School Learners

Two choices are available to learners and their families. You can either purchase a tablet then download free textbooks or obtain them electronically from the school, OR you can buy hardcopy textbooks.

Should you go the hardcopy textbook route, the sets required for next year will be sent home as a list via your children.

Should you go the tablet route, stores like PEP, Ackermans, and many others offer good deals, some under R1000. Then electronic textbooks can be obtained for free either at the school or online at such websites as these:

For Primary School Learners

Textbooks will be hard copies, actual books. Whilst we do not want to leave our younger learners behind technologically, we think tablet options for them run a higher risk of damage. The sets required for next year will be sent home as a list via your children.



No matter which option you choose, we want you to be aware of the amazing resources provided by two companies:

Vodacom e-School

In partnership with the Department of Basic Education, Vodacom e-School for grades 4 – 12 is a free service to anyone with a Vodacom sim card, making data free. All you need to do is register, and it works from a smart phone, a tablet or a desktop computer. You can also access it if you have other sim cards but then it is no longer free data access. Worldreader

This marvellous organisation gives all ages of readers free access to almost 46,000 books in 43 languages! It works on any internet-enabled phone, from a simple feature phone to the latest smartphone. Best of all, books can be downloaded then read later! Many of these books are fiction so our lower primary school learners will enjoy reading all the great stories from all over the world, and there are also some text books which secondary school learners can then also use as well.

The first club of Design Squad Global started in October 2016. Brought to us by our parent company Enko Education, Design Squad Global is an afterschool club run all over the world that does handson engineering, science and technology activities for young children. The members of the club must be 10 to 13 year olds from grades 4 to 6.

It has been a lot of fun for the young learners participating. Introduction letters to the partner club in Ohio, USA were sent and replies Ohio received. The club was supposed to have had only 8 to 12 members but the interest was so high, that we allowed it to grow to 19! Many thanks to Mr Kofi Mensah who has been a passionate co-leader and run these larger numbers, and to Ms Prudence Chihwayi who has given valuable support.

So far, the club members have made a pop up ball launcher, an assistance device which is a hand extender. They followed the engineering invention principles of identifying the problem they wanted to solve or make easier, designed on paper what they wanted to make, then went ahead and made it and unmade it until it was able to address what they wanted it to improve. We are so proud that our young learners understand invention and innovation and how it is usually achieved! Next step? Patents!

Two of the learners have composed a song for the club and we hope to be able to sing the song and record it for our partners in the United States before the end of this session. Mr Samuel Kofi Mensah, had this to say about the Design Squad Global club at our school: « Design Squad Global has been fantastic and interesting for us and our club members. It helps the learners to know how to solve problems using a scientific approach. It has also ignited the creative spirits in each of them to a higher height. The learners enjoy being with the club and brain storming with a group to solve daily problems that surround us and to lead them to achieve their life goals. »

«It is nice. I have never had a chance to create things to help people, Design Squad Global has given me that opportunity. At home I do not have the materials to make things. I enjoy working in groups because other people may see a mistake that you do not see.»
