Student mobility in Africa is high by global standards, and students are eager to study in the best universities in the world: Harvard, Oxford, Sciences Po, the University of Cape Town or the University of Hong-Kong are examples.

However, enrolling in those universities is an arduous challenge: preparation at high school level is sometimes inadequate to decode the complex admission processes, and national diplomas are not always understood or recognized abroad. This has led over the years to the under-representation of African students in the best international universities. Out of the 900,000 foreign students in the US, the most open country to students from abroad, only 31,000 come from Sub-Saharan Africa.

However, there is an increasing number of seats and opportunities for students from Africa to study in these top universities. More and more bursaries are available, such as the Scholars Program established by the MasterCard Foundation: a \$500-million initiative to provide access to secondary and higher education for young people – particularly from Africa – to lead change and make a positive social impact in their communities.

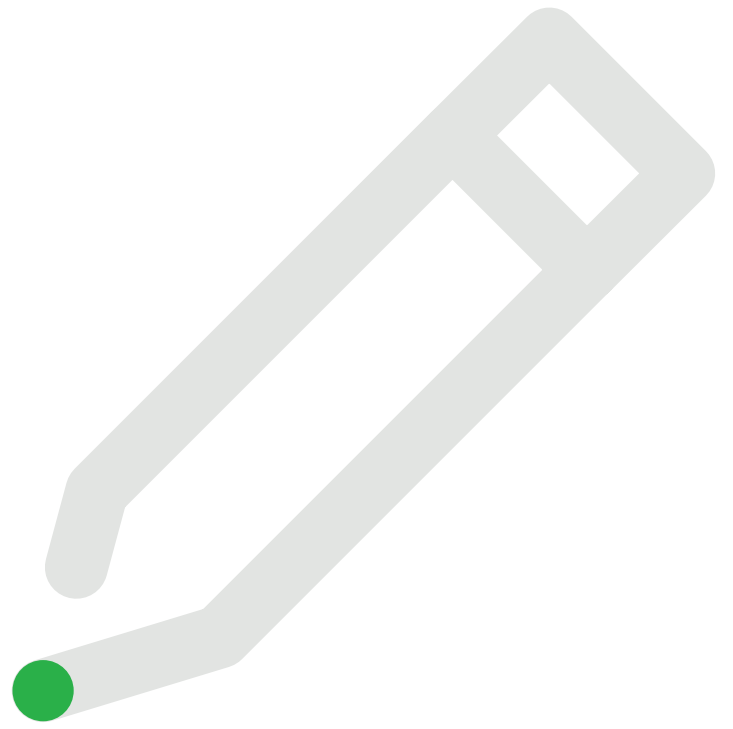

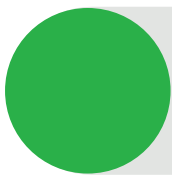
## International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme

## 2 Securing admission

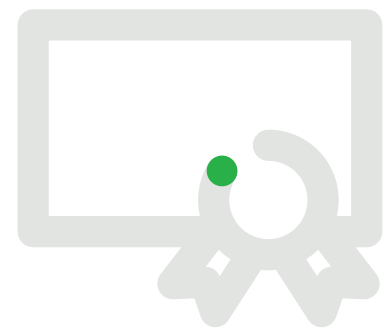
Enko Education provides students with its knowledge of admission procedures and relationships with universities' Admissions Officers, in order to help our students to build their application.
