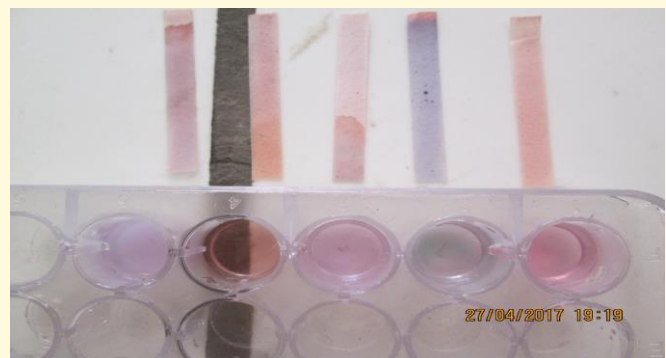


Uniforms
