The First Transdisciplinary Curriculum Unit of 2018

Our curriculum is the world renown International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme, also known as the IB PYP. It is a 40-year old curriculum, with over 1 million students enrolled in over 4000 world IB schools. The IB is the most accepted qualification into top universities; indeed, research shows it is more highly regarded than Cambridge even by the admissions officers of prestigious world universities.

Everything starts in early childhood. In our first focus – called the Programme of Inquiry or Pol – children in crèche will learn about who they are and what they can do. Important concepts for them will be biology, identity, diversity, body form and body control. In Year 1 and 2, children will wrestle with the central idea that the choices people make, affect their health and well-being. Critical concepts for them will be growth, choice, influence and balance. Years 3, 4 and 5 will focus on how interactions between human body systems support

our life functions. Essential concepts for them will be biology and systems. Lastly, our Year 6 and 7 will study how the changes people experience at different stages of their lives affect their evolving sense of self. Important concepts for them will be maturity, growth, systems, biology and well-being.

Our transdisciplinary units of study will always be accompanied by lessons in mathematics that focus on developing skill, strategy and confidence; targeted literacy development in the pursuit of excellence in reading and writing; and a plethora of complementary specials lessons in music, art, French, Chichewa, Portuguese and physical education and sports.

Project Development Overview and Status - Materia (www.materiainc.com)

Materia is happy to have delivered a first-class school campus for the use of Enko Benga International students and their families. The school campus designed by world-famous architect Francis Kéré, sprawls over 5 hectares of prime land. Enko Benga is located on the EN7. It is comprised of: c. 1,100m2 of enclosed classrooms, other learning areas, administration blocks, a kitchen and refectory with an additional c. 1,200m2 of covered corridors and meeting areas, well over 2,000m2 of open field playing areas, a swimming pool, a tennis and basketball court, a football field and a dedicated parking lot.



The EBIS campus has been developed following the sustainable and inclusive principles at the core of the Materia vision, including using local materials to develop the Tete economy, training a local workforce in best-in-class construction techniques for increasing their long-term entrepreneurial potential, and passive ventilation to lower the carbon footprint of our buildings.

Construction of the EBIS refectory has not yet been fully finalized so the school will be using the kitchen facilities of the Benga Riverside project, 300m from the campus. The swimming pool and changing rooms plus all other facilities will be fully ready in open in early February 2018, making the EBIS Campus one of the best campuses in the region.









School furniture and learning equipment and materials for Enko Benga International School, the new world class school in Tete, Mozambique, were designed, manufactured and/or procured by MIM Trading and Contracts. MiM has been serving private schools and government educational institutions, hospitals and other buildings all over southern Africa for many years. Our designs and manufacturing teams comprise of female and male designers, welders and carpenters, as a core part of our goal is gender parity. We also work across SADC (the Southern African Development Community) in order to infuse diverse pan-African thought into our designs and manufacturing methodologies.

Recent storms, tornadoes and flooding at our main factory outside Johannesbug have contributed to some the delays experienced in completing the provisioning of all school equipment. Before the destructive weather, most of the furniture was delivered and only assembly is outstanding. All assembly and installation will be completed by the end of January, and it is anticipated that the outstanding school supplies and equipment which were the hardest hit by the storms, will be sourced and delivered by then too.

For Enko Benga International School, this amalgamation of social purpose, indigenous knowledge systems and innovative design has resulted in the manufacturing of southern Africa's first height adjustable school tables and chairs for a primary school, a functional furniture design for the new nursery, the installation of upmarket telecom and security systems, unique hand made furniture for the library and reception areas, hand made indigenous musical instruments, rigid and sturdy construction to ensure years of usage and expansive outdoor play units for the nursery and primary school learners which also include an obstacle course.
