

## COMMUNIQUE TO THE PARENTS OF OUR DP2 STUDENTS FROM: ENKO BONANJO CAMPUS

Dear parents,

We have just received your children's results for the May 2020 session of the International Baccalaureate.

Over the last few hours we have analysed the IB assessment for each of our students and we find significant discrepancies in the predicted scores of the internal assessments in Mathematics, Chemistry, Physics and Computer science. No student scored more than 3 in Mathematics except for one student who scored 5. In Chemistry, Biology and Physics, no student scored more than 4, which seems to make no sense to us. Similarly, the assessments for Economics and ITGS were below what we predicted. However, all our students had high grades in English, Global Politics and French.

In the next few days we will try to get some explanations from the IB and it is only next Sunday that we will be able to access the detailed reports of the internal assessments.

In the meantime, dear parents, we understand your surprise and disappointment as we share them. What seems to us to be essential at the moment, before any reaction that would not be constructive, is to clarify the situation, to understand what correction mechanisms the IB applied in this particular context where there were no external examinations. It is too early to give answers, we have to wait a few days.

All parents of students who have not obtained their Diploma will be called in the next few hours. We will try to answer your questions with the information we have so far, and will get back to you as soon as we have more information.

We have accompanied your children throughout this school year with your confidence and support and it is in this same way that we must take the next steps.
