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Purpose of the CAS Camp

- Impact positively the character of students and lead them to time of reflections, before, during and after their journey, which is a fundamental pillar of CAS.

Important information

- Arrival at school at 7.00 am on Monday, January 30, 2023
- Return scheduled for Thursday, February 02, 2023; parents will come to school to pick up their children at the time that will be communicated on the day of return.
- The schedule of activities is presented below
- Participation is compulsory for all classes. Cost per student: 100.000 FCFA; Deadline for payment was December 20, 2022; This date has been extended to Friday, <u>January 20, 2023 at</u> 4:00 p.m. No payment will be received after this date.
- Parents should not allow a child who feels sick to travel. They
 need to be reassured of his/her health first by a medical
 personnel.
- There will not be school on Friday, February 03, 2023







Transport



- Students will be travelling by buses made available by a competent transportation service. Buses are equipped with seatbelts for travelers and air-conditioning; with qualified and experienced drivers of Douala-Foumban-Douala trajectory to transport the team till destination.
- Visiting sites are located in the environments of the hotels



Accomodation

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Male and female Students will be lodged in 2 separate hotels "Hotel Pekassa de Karche" and "Hotel Francioli" with the entire staff allocated in both hotels for supervision. You could visit online if you need more pictures of the premises. *Kindly note that there will be no swimming activities. These hotels are accessible to the major visiting sites of the main town area; and they are secured.

Students will be paired per room depending on the size of rooms / apartments; Rooms are

allocated by the staff per age groups / class. Siblings are allowed to sleep together.







Meals

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- 03 Meals will be available per day (Breakfast, lunch, Diner).
- Mineral Water will be available to students on a permanent basis.
- Parents are free to insert snacks in the traveling bags of the students
- Students will not be allowed to buy meals during the travelling journey. Snacks will be provided
- Parents should notify in case of any allergy/medical restriction to a meal.









Cell Phones / Laptop

- Students travelling with electronics(mobile phones/laptop/Tablets/camera) is strictly upon parents' authorization and the students should care and be responsible for them. However, those authorized to travel with these tools should be aware that their usage will be timely(mainly for pictures of the sites) and under supervision, for safety and discipline reasons.
- Video games and cards' games are not allowed!
- Laptops could be allowed only for IG2, FY, DP1 and DP2 students. They should strictly care for them and be used as working tools.
- All supervisors will be equipped with mobile phones, and we encourage parents to contact a supervisor, if they want to reach out to the children. All the students will be allowed to call their parents every evening from 6:30 or 7 p.m. During the day, we want the students to remain focus on their activities.
- General pictures and information of daily activities will be shared with parents on the parents WhatsApp group everyday to keep parents posted.

Safety and Security

- Students will be traveling with the whole staff.
- Travelers are lodged in accessible and secured hotels located at the center of the town. Specific instructions has been given to the hotel security for entry and exit in hotel.
- A code of conduct will be communicated to students before the trip.
- A group of supervisors have been trained in basic first aid and we are traveling with first aid kits. Also
 the District hospital, and the royal palace hospital are at a very close distance to the hotels in case of
 any emergency.
- The urban council will supervise the cleaning outdoor activities.
- All travelers are insured for the 4 days.
- 02 supervisors will be assigned per group of 10 to 12 children for supervision.
- Visit of relatives will not be authorized.
- Supervisors will be assigned to night duties on a rotational basis. Parents can contact supervisors to reach out to their children.
- Outdoors activities will be supervised by the staff and guided tours of the region.
- Parents should kindly notify to the school preferably before Friday 27 january, if their child has any health issues or specific medical recommendation.



Clothing

Students will receive a T-shirt to wear while traveling. Please bring your facial masks, and disinfectant(hand sanitizer) for the stay. The weather in the area at this season is mostly sunny during the day and cool in the morning and evening. Easy dressing are recommended (Sports trousers, Jean trousers, t-shirts (short and long–sleeved), closed sandals, light trainers, hat, socks, and hooded pullovers. Shorts, dresses and skirts without leggings are not recommended.




Students are required to travel with their enko sports uniform for their respective football matches and the cleaning activity.

A cultural dress will be needed as well. Appropriate walking shoes should be provided for their comfort. A pyjama, towels and underwear should be put in the student's bag for the stay.

Small travel bags are highly recommended and easy manageable. A small hand bag for outdoors activities to contain stuffs like a notebook, water bottle, hand sanitizer.
