

- Two testing options available to help monitor students' progress:
 - Cambridge Lower Secondary Progression Tests.
 - Cambridge Lower Secondary Checkpoint.
- Assessments identify and address strengths and weaknesses.
- Provide international benchmarks.
- Detailed reporting of student performance.

Research report

FOCUS : Global Perspective



- Cambridge Lower Secondary Checkpoint Global Perspectives is designed to be completed in the final year of lower secondary education.
- There are no written tests provided by Cambridge
 International
- Learners work individually to write a Research Report on one of the programme topics.

FOCUS : Global Perspective



- This research report must be between 800-1000 words.
- With the support and guidance of the teacher, students have to:
- Identify an issue related to one of the programme topics
- Formulate a research question based on this issue
- Respond to the research question by exploring both a global and national perspective on this issue

FOCUS : Global Perspective



- The national perspective does not have to be from the country in which the learner lives.
- The report should also explain how the global perspective chosen is genuinely global in nature. This could be because it is a viewpoint held by many people in different <u>countries</u> or <u>cultures</u>
- <u>Report submission date: March 29</u>

What you can do to help your child...



- Make sure they have submitted their checkpoint global perspective report
- Make sure they are well rested.
- Make sure they eat a light, but healthy breakfast!
- Make sure they get to school on time (7.45am at the latest)
- Make sure they bring their own equipment: 2 blue pens;
 2 pencils; an eraser; a ruler; a pair of compasses; a calculator; a protractor; a simple translating dictionary; a see through bottle of water

What happens with the results



- Results will reach the school near the end of June 2023
- Results will be shared with students, parents and staff
- Each student will have a statement of achievement and a diagnostic report
- The school will share the results with the wider school community





- Scores on the Checkpoint scale are from 0.0 to
 6.0
- Students achieving less than 2.0 have a basic understanding of the curriculum content
- Students achieving between 3.0 and 4.0 have a sound understanding of most of the curriculum content
- Students achieving more than 5.0 have and excellent understanding of the curriculum content



 Students should have a minimum of 3/6 in Mathematics, Science and English language/ESL; and a silver in global perspective to be admitted in upper secondary (IG 1)

Diagnostic Reports



- Helps schools to:
- Tailor individual learners' learning programmes
- Provide information for reporting to parents
- Compare the performance of all learners taking tests in that session
- Manage learning programmes as learners move between schools
- Evaluate the impact our curricular have on attainment
