Cambridge Upper Secondary international curriculum




- The International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) is one of the world's most popular international qualification for 14 to 16 year olds.

Cambridge Upper Secondary – assessment



- Assessment at end of the course
- Written, oral, coursework and alternative to practical assessment options give students opportunities to demonstrate learning.
- Options for students of different abilities.(core and Extended)
- Grades are A*-G, with A* being the highest.

IGCSE Examinations: How?



- IGCSE Board Examinations are conducted at Bonanjo Campus in the May/June session
- The answer scripts are sent to Cambridge for assessment.
- Results are declared in August

What you can do to help your child...



- Make sure they are well rested.
- Make sure they eat a light, but healthy breakfast!
- Make sure they get to school on time (7.45am at the latest)
- Make sure they bring their own equipment: 2 blue pens; 2 pencils; an eraser; a ruler; a pair of compasses; a calculator; a protractor; a simple translating dictionary; a see through bottle of water

Responsibility of the school



- Guided revisions sessions with Past Examination papers
- Extended sessions, to permit student have enough time to study
- Mock exams to assess students' level and come up with individualized action plans for students with difficulties
- Weekly ICT practical sessions
- In school study retreat during Easter break.

What happens with the results



- Results will reach the school in August
- Results will be shared with students, parents and staff
- Each student will have a statement of achievement and then a certificate
- The school will share the results with the wider school community

IGCSE Point Scale



- Cambridge IGCSEs are graded A*-G
- IGCSE results in individual subjects are indicated by the grades A*(a*), A(a), B(b), C(c), D(d), E(e), F(f) or G(g). Grade A*(a*) is awarded to those students showing highest ability in a subject and grade G(g) for a minimum satisfactory performance.
- Performances below the standard of grade
 G(g) are not recorded on certificates.

Requirements to move to the Diploma programme



•Students will need to have at least 5 C Grades in the subjects registered for to move to DP1.
