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About Enko Education

Enko Waca Campus is an African international school, member of the Enko Education network. Enko Education is the largest network of IB World Schools in Africa, with the mission of increasing access to the world's best universities for learners across Africa.

Enko Education has developed an innovative model. Our programmes lead to globally recognized and sought-after qualifications. We are able to offer those at a fraction of the cost charged by other international schools in Africa. Furthermore, Enko learners are supported in their higher education applications through our university guidance programme. We offer an outstanding learning experience striving to educate our learners with Africa at heart and the world in mind.

Enko Education model is showing impressive results with learners joining top universities like Yale University (USA), Sciences Po (Fr), the University of Toronto (Canada), African Leadership University (Rwanda) and many more. With currently 14 schools across 9 African countries, Enko Education aims at offering high-quality education to 100,000 students by 2030. Several international financing institutions, including Proparco, I&P, Oiko Credit and Liquid Africa, support Enko Education's ambition.

Our vision is to unlock learners' potential across Africa to enhance the global future. We do so by increasing access to the world's best universities and successful careers through high-quality international education. Four values guide us: we are Caring, Committed, Pathmakers and Team-Spirited.

School and Community

Enko Waca, formerly known as West African College of the Atlantic (2018) is a selective bilingual, secular and co-ed school, which opened its doors in 1996 in Dakar, Senegal with the ambition to offer its students a bilingual education with an international perspective. Enko Waca was the first International Baccalaureate school in Senegal, achieving accreditation in September 2000. In September 2018, Enko Education acquired the school and became Enko Waca Campus. Its objective is to prepare students for social and professional success, opening the door to opportunities to study at internationally-recognized institutions of higher education, and to provide students with the means to become responsible global citizens by learning individual responsibility and collective action. Our learners are mostly Senegalese from middle-class families, with the ambition to study in the world's best universities. Learners learn to grow African roots and global wings, by learning about their African cultures while being exposed to travel opportunities through study tours and conferences. Our current alumni make up some of Senegal's leading entrepreneurs, politicians, and financial advisors.

Enko Waca has highly-qualified personnel: all our staff receive up to 100 hours of professional development per year. The school currently has around 300 learners.

Curriculum

The institution is accredited by the Senegalese Ministry of Education and the International Baccalaureate Organization in Geneva. From Grade 7 to Grade 10, Enko Waca provides a French-based Senegalese secondary education reinforced by elements from French, British and American programs, leading to the Senegalese BFEM, and the International Baccalaureate Bilingual Diploma Programme in Grade 12 and 13. For learners coming from the national curriculum, Enko Waca has developed a "Foundation Year" in Grade 11, which allows learners to transition to the IB curriculum and to maximize their chances of success at the IB.

Grading and ranking procedures

Students at Enko Waca Campus are neither ranked and nor do they receive a cumulative GPA. Grading is based on the International Baccalaureate (IB) grade system of 1-7 scale with 3 being the minimum passing grade, Theory of Knowledge and Extended Essay are part of the two-year IB Diploma. Students take 6 courses and could earn up to 42 points. This is added to the possible 3 points for exemplary performance in TOK course and Extended Essay. Thus, the total point score is 45. Enko Waca Campus does not convert IB points to any other grading system.
